- 1. In today's Gospel (Mk 1:29-39) where do you see most clearly evidence Jesus Christ as the Son of God? What is the purpose behind the healings? Could someone come up with a "human" explanation for the miraculous?
- 2. In the Gospel Jesus prays. Who is praying, the human part of Jesus or his divinity?

IN BRIEF CCC 452-455, 261-262 ("Son")

- 3. Does Jesus have to be divine to be the Messiah ("Anointed One")?
- 4. How could the Son of God be "God from God" and yet be equal with God the Father?

IN BRIEF CCC 479-483, 508-511, 565-570 ("Incarnate")

- 5. Would it have been easy for people of Jesus' day to accept his divinity?
- 6. What does it mean when we say Jesus is *fully* human *and fully* God?
- 7. If God becomes man, what does this say about the sacraments, especially the Eucharist ("This is my Body; this is my Blood")?
- 8. How does the Incarnation ("enfleshing") of Jesus influence our understanding of Mary (Hint: one of her titles is "Theotokos" the God-bearer)?
- 9. How does the Catholic Church explain Mary's status before God?
