Meeting Questions

- 1. How is the forgiveness of sins linked to the Holy Spirit, Christ and the sacrament of Baptism? (para. 984, 985). See Rom 6.3-7 (OR, p. 118).
- 2. A sacrament is a physical means joined to the word of God. What is the physical means (instrument) for forgiveness of sins?
- 3. Which sacraments are directly related to forgiveness? Bonus Q: Why can't a deacon provide a sick person the Sacrament of the Sick ("Oil of Anointing") Hint: see para. 986
- 4. What's the difference between a sacrament and a sacramental? In what way is the Church a sacrament?
- 5. Para 1275 Links Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. With the exception of adults, why aren't these three "Sacraments of Initiation" completed at the same time? Bonus Q: what are infused and imputed grace, and how do they work through these sacraments?
- 6. Para. 1277 says Baptism is necessary for salvation. What about those who believe but aren't baptized before they die?
- 7. What's the difference between the effect of the Holy Spirit in Baptism and in that of Confirmation? According to para. 1313 and 1314, why do we have to wait for a bishop to confirm young baptized Catholics? What's the exception?
